

Salah Expectations:

- a. Students wearing nail polish/fake nails will be required to remove those immediately and receive a warning.
- b. Students are expected to arrive in the salah area prepared:
 - punctually
 - with wudu
 - with prayer rug (Students will not be allowed to go to their lockers to retrieve forgotten items during salah time).
 - Shoes placed neatly in designated area
- c. Students are expected to show the respect appropriate for the occasion, like walking to and from the prayer area in an orderly and quiet manner; remaining quiet during the athan, salah and du'aa rituals.
- d. Female students who are excused from prayer are required to sit in the back of the prayer area.
- e. Students will be teamed up according to their grade levels. Each team will have designated prayer rows and adjacent shoe storage areas. Prayer rows will be assigned as follows:
 - Boys will be arranged from 9th to 4th
 - Girls will be arranged from 4th to 9th.
- f. A prayer schedule for the roles of Mu'athin, Muqem and Imam is to be drawn up, distributed to teachers and posted in the prayer area.
- g. Prayer areas for KG-3rd = respective classrooms. Grades 4-9 will pray in the gym.
- h. Islamic Studies teachers are expected to clarify salah expectations and discipline policy to their students.

Salah Discipline Policy:

- i. Students who do not meet the expectations for salah without a sound reason will receive a warning. Their names will be submitted to their teachers, who will then apply the grade-appropriate discipline policy in place.
- j. Teams who have the least amount of warnings for the month will be Salah Stars for that month. They will have their picture put up in the front office. Winning team members who have received a warning in that month, will not be included in the team picture.
